The University of Pittsburgh's William Pitt Union is located in the historic Schenley Hotel. In addition to several small projects for Career Services and the Office of International Students, Moshier Studio has recently designed several floors to support new Student Life goals.

Recreation Area | Complete renovation of the basement level meets the need for large gathering and performing space, and provides an alternative to the 'bar scene' for students. It contains lounges, a smoothie bar, multi-player gaming simulators, pool tables, stage and dance floor. New HVAC and lighting systems meet energy requirements while updating the look and performance of the area.

The Cultural Center | The 6th floor is completely renovated and provides offices and gathering spaces for the cross-cultural leadership center and a variety of student groups and staff, to fosters collaboration.

Government Floor | The renovated 8th floor houses all student government organizations which includes a Senate chamber for the student government board, and space for non-traditional and graduate student organization leadership.

Meeting Floor | The renovated 5th floor houses lounges, meeting rooms for student organizations and for University events, and a fitness/dance area.
